

Blackwater Carr - Norfolk

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Woodland and forestry agents



Blackwater Carr presents a unique opportunity to become the steward of a remarkable site rich in biodiversity, situated along the River Yare in the heart of the [Norfolk Broads](#).

The current owners, with the help of dedicated volunteer groups, have invested years of effort to transform this land into a truly enchanting space. Once inside, Blackwater Carr feels like a secluded haven, with well-maintained pathways guiding you through its tranquil surroundings and highlighting various natural features.

The area is home to a variety of tree species, including willow, sessile oak, hawthorn, hazel, alder and guelder rose. Recent planting efforts have introduced crab apple, rowan, aspen, oak, wild cherry, alder, birch and bay willow to the landscape. At ground level, the flora is abundant, with grasses, reeds, hemp agrimony, marsh woundwort, yellow flag, thistle and meadow rue.

Surrounding dykes not only provide effective drainage but also attract an array of wildlife. The site is a haven for species like wildfowl, barn and tawny owls, bats, marsh harriers, herons, Chinese water deer, water voles, grass snakes, and even the occasional otter. A cozy yurt equipped with a wood burner offers shelter on rainy days, complemented by a composting toilet and a well-constructed storage shed with solar panels supplying power to the yurt and shed. The owners also enjoy private access to a nearby riverbank via a shared path.

Conveniently, The Ferry House pub is just a short paddle away, and the city of Norwich is only a few minutes' drive from the meadow.

Blackwater Carr has been designated as a County Wildlife site, and as such, is able to call on local conservation groups for assistance managing the site and having recorded nearly 1000 species. An excel spreadsheet and photos over time will be made available to the next buyer.
